

GWINNETT SENIOR GOLDEN GAMES

Dominoes



- **The game:** Place all tiles on table facing down-spots down. Games are played to 100 points. Winners will move to new table and losers stay. 3 matches total for total score.
- **Setup:** Two, three or four players based on registration per table. Each player draws dominoes, if two players, each player draws 7 tiles, if three or four players, each player draws 5 dominoes.
- **Play:**
 - The player with the highest double set lays the tile face up in the middle of the table. Double set is the same number of spots on both sides of the domino. If no player has a double, then all tiles are replaced.
 - Play continues in a clockwise motion around the table.
 - Player 2 places a domino with the same number of spots at a right angle to the first one.
 - If player 2 is unable to play he must pass and play moves to the next player.
 - Players take turns laying dominoes on one of the two open ends. Single tiles must be played end to end and double tiles must cross. Singles are a tile with 2 different spots on each side.
 - After placing a domino on the table, a player selects another tile from the pile.

- When a player is placing the last domino from his hand, he must call DOMINO.

- **Scoring:**

- The other players turn up all the remaining dominoes in their hands and total the spots on them.
- The total number of spots from the unplaced dominoes is the score for the winner.
- If players are no longer able to place dominoes on the board the last player to place a domino is declared the winner and his total number of spots remaining on his board are subtracted from the total number of spots left on the table. IE: player 1 placed the last tile and has 15 spots in his hand, player 2 has 17 spots in his hand, player 3 has 9 spots in his hand and player 4 has 20 spots in his hand. Total # of spots = 61 spots – player 1 (the winner) 15 spots = 46 points for player 1.
